

Yorkiepoo temperament

Yorkiepoos, being the results of a union between Yorkshire Terriers and Poodles, are blessed with a very aesthetically appealing appearance. They are also very good pets to have, with their ancestors already having a reputation for being great household pets.

Therefore, you should take into consideration your own noise tolerance level before getting a Yorkiepoo - their watchdog capabilities makes them somewhat prone to barking.

Intelligent

Being part Poodle, Yorkiepoos are highly intelligent, making them highly trainable. However, being also part Yorkshire, it may also be a little stubborn. Thus, expect housebreaking to be somewhere in between a Poodle (fairly easy) and a Yorkshire (not as easy) in terms of difficulty level.

Having a fairly good genetic and temperament pool to draw from, Yorkiepoos are often very good pets to have. Even so, you should be aware of possibility of Yorkiepoos inheriting some fairly troublesome temperaments from its parents. If such a situation happens, remember that patience goes a long way in molding it into a great companion.
